**23rd October:** Our Service of Morning Worship was conducted by Revd. David Stranack who joined us for a welcome return as Revd. Judith and her husband Rufus were on holiday. Thank you to Nancy Roser for leading our singing on the organ. Also, thank you to our readers and helpers with the refreshments.

**13th November:** The Service of Remembrance was conducted by Revd Gerald Drew. It did not seem that a year had gone by since he took last years' service. The sun shone through the East window casting light on the vase of poppies as Revd. Drew welcomed us and especially Harry Buckledee to place the beautiful wreath of poppies in front of the Altar and to read the names of those who died from Newton in the First and Second World Wars. It is thought provoking to realise the number of 15 young men from the village died in the First World War, which must have impacted on everyone in Newton. At the end of the two minutes silence the Kohima Declaration was read. "When you go home, tell them of us and say: For your tomorrow, we gave our today ". This must have been very poignant for Harry, himself a remarkable Second World War veteran. The words were first put together among a collection of twelve epitaphs and are on the 15-foot memorial monolith made of Naga stone in Kohima, Nagaland, North East India commemorating the battle around the town of Kohima. Communion was celebrated and after prayers the National Anthem was led by Revd. Drew's wife Jane, as our organist had to slip out quietly to play the organ at another service. Afterwards, we were joined at the War Memorial on the Green by many, including young families and new people to the village as Revd. Gerald Drew led the second Service of Remembrance and the two minutes' silence in bright sunshine and a cold wind. Thank you to all who attended, Harry, Revd. Drew and his wife.

Thank you to all who came to join us for various services during this year. A special thank you to Revd. Judith for all that she does for us in our church and out in our village community and to our Churchwarden, Christine Cornell and her team, our organist who rushes from one church service to another. We appreciate the ' behind the scenes ' work that Rufus does for us in many ways.

We wish all a peaceful Christmas and for the coming year.

## Newton War Memorial

We were very lucky with the weather this year and there was a great turnout on Remembrance Sunday, with villagers gathering at the war memorial to pay homage to the men from Newton who gave their lives for our freedom.

Times have changed enormously in the 90+ years since the memorial was erected. One thing that wouldn't have been an issue back then was the noise of the traffic, but it certainly is now. I was stood no more than fifteen feet from the reverend who was pretty-well shouting to be heard, and I still couldn't hear at times. How people behind me managed I am not sure. It has been the same for several years now; the traffic isn't going to get any quieter and this problem isn't going away. If our memorial was being erected for the first time now, I wonder where we would have located it? As well as the noise of the traffic, the uneven ground, access and parking are all issues faced each year by many villagers who are less mobile than they were.

To that end, I have written to my fellow parish councillors to propose we consider taking steps to improve matters. For instance, if we turned the war memorial 180 degrees so that the remembrance ceremony takes place the far side of it, away from the A134. This would make it much easier to hear the reverend and speakers, as they would be between us and the traffic, and we would all be further from the road. Or, we could simply invest in a portable PA to let the reverend compete with the traffic noise more easily – although that won't help parking or if the uneven ground is a problem too.

However, perhaps moving the war memorial to an entirely different location, such as Jubilee Gardens or creating a new space just outside the village hall car park entrance may be worth considering. Such a location would keep the memorial at the heart of our community and make it much easier for our elders to reach, including so many villagers who served alongside the fallen and are naturally determined to be at the remembrance ceremony each year. With the car park, a level tarmac lane to stand on and being a good 50 yards further from the A134, that could be made a lovely location.

War memorials are very emotive and moving ours isn't something we should undertake without full discussion in the community. I would very much want our veterans at the heart of discussions and decisions over this proposal.



What are the advantages or disadvantages of a new location? Any suggestions? We need to know that whatever decision is taken, including to leave things as they are, it has the support of the village.



**DRAFT MINUTES OF NEWTON PARISH COUNCIL MEETING**  
**Held on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> November 2016 in Newton Village Hall at 7.30pm**

**Present:** Councillors Paul Presland (Chairman), Russell Bower, Sue Crawte, Lee Parker, Rita Schwenk and Phil Taylor.

**Attending:** Lee Parker (Babergh District Councillor), James Finch (Suffolk County Councillor) and D Crimmin (Clerk).

**16/156 Apologies for Absence**

Cllr Poole (work commitment) sent his apologies.

**16/157 Declaration of Interests and Requests for Dispensation**

Cllr Parker declared a local non-pecuniary interest in item 16/163 as he is a member of Babergh District Council's Planning Committee. He also asked for the minutes to record that in respect of item 16/163b he is known to the applicant via a business arrangement and elected to remain for the debate on the item but did not to take part in the subsequent vote. No request for dispensation had been received.

**16/158 Minutes of meeting held on the 12<sup>th</sup> October 2016**

The minutes of the meeting were approved by the councillors and signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

**16/159 Public Forum**

James Finch updated councillors on his previously circulated report and gave further information on Suffolk's Early Years Foundation Stage Profile Results for 2016, the new Greater Anglia rail franchise and Be Safe and Seen in Suffolk. He updated councillors on the re-consultation for the proposed speed reductions on the A134 and will review with officers the suggestion of a painted roundabout at the A1071 and A134 junction. He also updated councillors on the Raising the Bar grant available from the Suffolk Foundation that may be of interest to the council. Lee Parker updated councillors on the newly appointed CEO for Babergh.

**16/160 Correspondence (Appendix A)**

Following a review of the Correspondence and the emails circulated since the last meeting there were no further actions requested of the Clerk.

**16/161 Clerks Report (Appendix B)**

Following a review of the Clerk's Report there were no further actions requested of the Clerk.

**16/162 Finance**

- a. All cheques signed and due for signing, as itemised in the RFO Report (Appendix C), were authorised by the councillors. The councillors also noted the income received since the last meeting, agreed the Reconciliation of Accounts against the Bank Statements and reviewed the Statement of Accounts against the budget.
- b. The councillors reviewed the Budget Proposal (Appendix D) and resolved to set an Expenditure Budget of £11,706 for 2017 / 2018.
- c. The councillors reviewed the application for a grant towards NPC's costs in complying with the Transparency Code and resolved that the Clerk submit the application to SALC for consideration.

**16/163 Planning**

- a. The councillors reviewed **Planning Application B/16/01330 Newton Hall, Church Road - Application for Listed Building Consent - Remedial works to rebuild secondary staircase in breakfast room** and resolved to support the application.

**DRAFT MINUTES OF NEWTON PARISH COUNCIL MEETING**  
**Held on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> November 2016 in Newton Village Hall at 7.30pm**

- b. The councillors reviewed information received from Babergh on the amendments to **Planning Application B/16/01038 Red House Farm, Sudbury Road** - Erection of 10 no dwellings (following demolition of existing dwelling and outbuildings). The Planning Officer had informed the Clerk that as the applicant is not proposing to modify the application in terms of the issues raised by NPC, and is only addressing the issues raised by SCC Highways, there would not be a re-consultation of the application with NPC. Babergh has confirmed that BDC Councillor Lee Parker has called the application in for determination by the Planning Committee as the planning officer's minded decision and NPC's decision to support the application differ. It was indicated that the meeting will probably take place on the 30th November 2016 and NPC will be able to address the Planning Committee on the matter. The councillors reviewed the decision that it made at the 14<sup>th</sup> September 2016 meeting which was as follows:

*The councillors reviewed **Planning Application B/16/01038 Red House Farm, Sudbury Road** - Erection of 10 no dwellings (following demolition of existing dwelling and outbuildings) and resolved to support the application subject to the following being incorporated into the proposed development:*

- i. *Footway along the A134 in front of the development*
- ii. *A footpath be constructed from the development to the village green, allowing residents to access the village centre, avoiding the need to twice cross the A134*
- iii. *Permanent speed activated signage being installed on the A134*
- iv. *A crossing for pedestrians to walk safely across the A134 to and from the development.*

As NPC's concerns directly relate to the safety of pedestrians crossing the A134 to access the proposed site, the councillors were concerned that these issues were not being addressed by the applicant. The councillors resolved that for NPC to continue to support the application, the following items must be included in the proposed development:

- Footway along the A134 in front of the development
- Permanent speed activated signage being installed on the A134
- A crossing for pedestrians to walk safely across the A134 to and from the development.

The councillors further resolved that NPC will make a representation to the Planning Committee on the above concerns.

- c. No further planning application had been received since the agenda was posted.  
d. The status of previous applications and appeals were reviewed.

It was put in working order and the work paid for by Milton Abbey, a village in Dorset, to use while their own organ was being restored. When that is completed our organ will then be valued and advertised for sale. GW.
