

22nd July:



Mental health services – Have your say!
People living in east and west Suffolk are being urged to have their say about local mental health services as part of a unique engagement opportunity.
The NHS lpswich & East Suffolk and NHS West Suffolk clinical commissioning groups (CCGs) want to transform the way mental health provision is delivered across the county.
In order to do that, they first need to find out how effective the people who deliver and receive the current services think they are.
Commissioners want to hear from people who currently use or have previously used mental health services, those who care for them and the staff who deliver those services.
All three groups are being asked to input their feedback via three surveys that 'go live' from this morning (Monday 2nd July).
The surveys are part of a much larger engagement exercise that aims to help create a new model for east and west Suffolk that will bring mental and physical health services much closer together.
In a break from usual practice, the CCGs have commissioned four local voluntary sector organisations to engage with local people under the banner "The future of mental health – a very different conversation".
Suffolk Family Carers, Suffolk User Forum and Suffolk Parent Carer Network will co-ordinate a whole host of mental health workshops and events to gather feedback on the current services.
Healthwatch Suffolk will then gather and analyse the feedback before preparing a report making a case for change for the CCGs' governing body meetings in November.

Guidance for golf on the green at Newton

Upon registering annually with the club and booking in at the professional's shop before play, residents of the village can enjoy nine holes free golf on the village green. All guests must pay a green fee. An extra nine holes on the private side of the course can be played after paying the appropriate fee at the club shop.

Villager-Plus Membership

To enjoy regular, 18-hole golf, residents can take out Villager-Plus membership of the club, which involves paying half the normal full, seven-day fee (£377.50 in 2017-18). Subject to the guidance of the professional's shop, play will be available daily from 10.30 am, and 12.30 pm on Saturdays. A condition of Villager Plus membership involves a free, one-hour, introductory session with the club professional.

The club operates with a full, open licence, and facilities are available for private hire, with many social functions open to village residents

IT'S ALL SO LONG AGO Extracts from Parish Magazines from the past Compiled by Alan Vince – Village Historian

60 YEARS AGO – Newton Newsleaf produced by Rev A G Ensor. AUGUST 1958:

Editorial: Dear Friends, how often one hears someone make a remark such as this: 'Village life is not what it used to be' or 'In Newton everyone goes to Sudbury for their entertainment'. Strange as it may seem, however, there is probably more going on in Newton today than at any time in the past. What is lacking however, is the unity & sense of community which used to exist in village life but has now to a large extent disappeared or is disappearing. The various village activities seem to exist independently of one another without any central focusing point. It was in order to try to remedy this state of affairs that when I came to Newton three years ago, I started the Newton Newsleaf. What I now feel may be a helpful development in Newton would be to form some kind of central village committee on which all the interests which exist in the village are represented. Such a committee could have considerable influence by discussing the views and interests of its members and as a local body to be involved in such matters as preserving the village from unwanted planning and development schemes, and also to further such planning and development which Is generally desired and in the interest of all concerned. The organizations in Newton at the present time are the Church and Chapel, The Golf Club, The Women's Institute, The Fireside Club, The Youth Club, The Discussion Group, The Darts Club, The Village Hall Committee and The Green Committee. If there is sufficient support for this suggestion, a meeting can be called; if not, the matter will of course be dropped. A.G.Ensor

40 YEARS AGO - Newton Newsletter edited by Frank Rowland

25 YEARS AGO – Newton Newsletter edited by Gaspard Willis AUGUST 1992:

Joyce Payne: It was a sad loss to her many friends in the village when she died on 29th June. It was a tribute to her bright, cheerful character that so many people came to her funeral on 7th July.

In spite of all her pain and difficulties after her fall, breaking a bone which could not be healed, she was still as bright as ever when my wife and I went to see her in Walnuttree hospital. Things must have been very trying for her for quite a long time with Philip being so badly disabled. But she always made the best of it and used to ride around on her electric driven tricycle to visit her friends or go to the village shop. Of course, her first thoughts and care were for her husband and family, but she was also much loved by all of us in Newton and will be sadly missed. R.I.P.

Bill Hills: With just the notification of Bill's funeral in the Newsletter I felt I must write a few words about him. I knew Bill and his brother Fred all their lives, and for me, there is great sadness that there are few of my generation left Bill could be very stubborn sometimes but he was always ready to give someone a helping hand. I found that out on many occasions. He was a hard worker, and his hedges were a treat to be seen. He kept them in marvellous condition and he did the same for the church yard which he tended for many years. With his brother he worked very hard on his father's smallholding, with very little remuneration, and life for a boy and then teenager was not easy.

Years ago when Newton had a football team, he was a keen member. Matches were played against other villages and Bill has many medals, including the cup for being top of the league. He spent all his life in Red House Farm, which his grandfather built when he left London to come to live in Newton. N.Millyard

Gardening Notes: As soon as summer fruiting raspberries have finished, the old canes should be cut out leaving the new growths room to develop for fruiting next year. Cuttings should be taken now to produce a standard Fuschia for next year. Root cuttings in a half peat – half sand mixture and when rooted pot up in to three inch pots placing a supporting cane in each pot. Tie the stem to the cane leaving enough room for growth, yet making sure that the stem is well supported. The plants must be kept growing throughout the winter and they will do so in a temperature of 40-45 F. Remove side shoots as they appear but leave the leaves on as these are needed for the development of the stem.




