





18/059 Election of Chairman

Cllr Presland was unanimously elected as Chairman of Newton Parish Council (NPC) and signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office before taking the chair.

18/060 Apologies for Absence

James Finch (Suffolk County Councillor) sent his apologies.

18/061 Election of Vice Chairman

It was unanimously resolved that Cllr Crawte be elected the Vice Chairman of NPC.

18/062 Declaration of Interests and Requests for Dispensation

Cllr Poole declared a non-pecuniary interest in item 17/086 as his authority uses Heelis & Lodge as its Internal Auditor and did not take part in the vote.

18/063 Minutes of meeting held on the 11th April 2018

The minutes of the meeting which had previously been circulated were approved as a true record.

18/064 HR and Standards Committees

Cllrs Bower, Crawte and Taylor were appointed to the HR Committee. Cllrs Parker, Poole and Schwenk were appointed to the Standards Committee.

18/065 Representatives to Outside Bodies

It was resolved that the following appointments be made:

- a. Newton Green Trust (NGT) Clirs Taylor and Poole.
- b. Village Hall Management Committee Cllr Schwenk.
- c. Alston & Plampin Charity Mr A. Vince, Mrs M Williams and Mr J. Taylor.
- d. Cllr Presland was appointed as the representative to the Suffolk Association of Local Councils.

18/066 Internal Auditor

It was resolved that Heelis & Lodge be appointed as Internal Auditor for 2018 / 2019 and the Clerk to send the letter of engagement.

18/067 Annual Subscriptions

It was resolved to renew the annual membership to the Suffolk Association of Local Councils, Community Action Suffolk and The Society for Local Council Clerks for 2017 / 2018.

18/068 Public Forum

Cllr James Finch (Suffolk County Council) provided a report to be read at the meeting. Items covered include:

- a. More than 94% of Suffolk children offered first choice of primary school.
- b. Proposal to change home to school travel policy; I will be reflecting the local feedback I have had from my parishes. The main requests are that youngsters do not have to change their existing schools where the choice of school was made and implemented before any change in policy.
- c. Call for "On-Call" firefighters People interested in becoming an on-call firefighter must be 18 or older, and live or work ideally within five minutes or possibly up to ten minutes of a fire station. More information on the role of on-call firefighters can be found at <u>https://www.suffolk.gov.uk/suffolk-fire-andrescue-service/working-and-volunteering-for-fire-and-rescue/how-to-become-an-on-call-firefighter/</u>

Cllr Presland requested the clerk to enquire how many children were offered their first choice of secondary school.

Cllr Parker (Babergh District Council) reported that he had nothing further to add to his report at the Annual Village Assembly.

18/065 Clerks Report

- Hastoe were unable to provide an update on the proposed housing development. Clerk and Chairman to endeavor to get a report before the next meeting.
- b. Clerk to produce a note for the Parish Magazine regarding poor broadband signal in Newton.
- c. Clerk to investigate progress made by Suffolk Highways regarding drainage problems in Church Road.
- d. GDPR Update MPs accepted the Government amendment to exempt all parish and town councils and parish meetings in England and community and town councils in Wales from the requirement to appoint a Data Protection Officer under the General Data Protection Regulation. All other requirements of the GDPR will apply and will come into force on 25th May.

18/066 Finance

- NPC reviewed and resolved to accept the internal auditors report from Heelis & Lodge for 2017/2018 and noted the recommendations made:
 - 1. NPC reviewed the contents of the Asset Register and agreed that the lap-top should be added.
 - 2. NPC reviewed the its Risk Assessment, Standing Orders and Financial Regulations.
- b. NPC noted discrepancies in the annual return and asked the clerk to represent the annual return for approval at the next meeting.
- c. All cheques signed and due for signing, as itemised in the RFO Report (Appendix A), were authorised by the councillors.
- d. NPC noted the increase of approximately 2% to the Clerk's hourly rate from 1st April 2018.

IT'S ALL SO LONG AGO Extracts from Parish Magazines from the past Compiled by Alan Vince – Village Historian

60 YEARS AGO – Newton Newsleaf produced by Rev A G Ensor. SUMMER 1958:

Newton Green Youth Club: Meetings were held in the Spring every Tuesday when Rounders was played on the Green until dusk, after which the members retired to the Hall for refreshments. It was hoped as lighter evenings became longer, certain outdoor activities might be organised but it was later felt that owing to lack of support for outdoor activities, it would be better to partially close the club for the summer and reopen again in the Autumn. A cycle competition was arranged in the Spring but through lack of support a very pleasant ride through Stoke & district took its place. It was agreed that later in the year an excursion to the coast by coach should be arranged.

The Village Hall: A grant for the village hall of £126 has been received from the Ministry of Education and a gift of £25 from Mr R Kemble. A series of Whist Drives for the Village Hall have been a great success.

40 YEARS AGO - Newton Newsletter edited by Frank Rowland JUNE 1978:

"Thanks for the Memory": Another lovely article entitled "Happy Memories" from Mrs Hilda Vince, so very well known to all of us in Newton.

"It was in 1912 that my father took me to the Crystal Palace to hear the Brass Bands Contest, at which I was very thrilled. On July 9th 1921 we went to the Crystal Palace again, this time to the Choir Festival. His choir sang in the Festival and gained Fourth place. I was in that, together with four of my sisters, singing the part song 'Early One Morning', an old English folk song. In the evening was the Festival Concert, with 1000 people in the choirs, making a wonderful concert, which as you can see, I have never forgotten. My father was Bandmaster of the Norwich Co-operative Band for 25 years, eventually retiring in 1913. He was also organist at Magdalen Road Congregational Church for 24 years, as well as being Choirmaster.

I have, of course, many happy memories of Newton Chapel when Mrs Dedman's father, Mr Bruce, played his Piccolo, Mr Sparrow on his Bass and myself on the Harmonium, all playing and singing hymns on a Sunday evening. Our daughters Edna and Sylvia played the organ at Newton Church before they were married, and they were also in the choir."

Women's Institute: The schedule for the W.I. Rose Bowl at the Mid-Summer Fete on July 8th will be, for W.I. members only – A waist apron, Madeira cake (to a given recipe),

1lb Marmalade, 1 jar of lemon curd, 6 ginger biscuits, bottle of home-made wine, 1 rose and an 18" arrangement of flowers, to face front. For Village children, and children of Members, a vegetable man and a picture of a Village Scene. There will not now be an organised outing to the Village Maps Exhibition at Bury, Members must make their own arrangements.

25 YEARS AGO – Newton Newsletter edited by Kathy Searles JULY 1993:

Village Hall Notes: It seems that the vandals are at it again. 
