Guidance for golf on the green at Newton

Upon registering annually with the club and booking in at the professional's shop before play, residents of the village can enjoy nine holes free golf on the village green. All guests must pay a green fee. An extra nine holes on the private side of the course can be played after paying the appropriate fee at the club shop.

Villager-Plus Membership

To enjoy regular, 18-hole golf, residents can take out Villager-Plus membership of the club, which involves paying half the normal full, seven-day fee (£377.50 in 2017-18). Subject to the guidance of the professional's shop, play will be available daily from 10.30 am, and 12.30 pm on Saturdays. A condition of Villager Plus membership involves a free, one-hour, introductory session with the club professional.

LAVENHAM SINFONIA – CONCERT SEPTEMBER 22nd at LAVENHAM CHURCH
The Lavenham Sinfonia just keeps getting better as anyone who heard the magnificent performance of Brahms 1st Symphony will tell you, the great horn call that opened the final movement is still echoing around the Church.

The evening began with Weber's sparkling overture to his final opera "Oberon" and was followed by Neilsen's Flute Concerto composed in 1926. The concerto is unusual being in 2 quite short movements and prominently featuring a bass-trombone in the orchestra. This concerto has a challenging solo part for the flute and the soloist, Stefan Cunningham handled it expertly seemingly never taking a breath whilst playing the long solo parts. The concert concluded with the magisterial Brahms 1st Symphony.

The Sinfonia's final concert of the 2019 season is on 22 September at 19:00 in Lavenham Church when, by popular demand, it returns to once again to explore the Baroque era of music. This promises to be a spectacular occasion with the concert opening with Bach's Brandenburg Concerto No1. The Brandenburg's remain amongst Bach's most popular works and the Sinfonia has chosen to play the earlier version of the score which is one movement shorter than the normal edition. It will be followed Antonio Vivaldi's Concerto for Strings in G minor RV156, a spirited work in 3 movements in the quasi venetian style.

Bach returns to conclude the first part of the programme with E major Violin Concerto played by the soloist Rebecca Livermore. This concerto is one of 2 Violin concertos thought to have been composed in 1718 and Bach obviously liked the themes as they re-appear again in his later Harpsichord Concertos.

Johann. Heinichen was a German baroque composer born in 1683 and was very influential in bringing the venetian style of music to Dresden. A prolific composer in his day, his music was rather forgotten until Reinhard Goebel and Musica Antiqua Koln in 1992 recorded several CD's of his concertos and thereby increased his popularity. His Orchestral Suite in G major S.205 that opens the second half is a really good example of his compositions as is in 6 short movements Overture, Air, Bourrée, Air, Rigaudon, Air-Viste.

The concert concludes with Handel's fantastic Music for the Royal Fireworks composed in 1749 for George 2nd's firework display in Green Park to mark the end of the War of the Austrian Succession and the signing of the peace treaty at Aix-La-Chapelle. Originally scored for a large wind band with brass and kettledrums, Handel re-scored the work a month so or later to include a string section. It remains one of Handel's popular and enduring pieces and, fittingly, brings the 2019 season to a close.

Please do come along and enjoy some fine music playing and please also give some thought to becoming a patron (£75 per year) or a Friend (£35 per year) and support one of the few orchestra's playing live music in Norfolk and Suffolk. Details are on the website at www.lavenham-sinfonia.co.uk.

19/067. Apologies for Absence

Cllr. Presland and James Finch (Suffolk County Council) sent their apologies.

19/068. Declaration of Interests and Requests for Dispensation

None.

19/069. Minutes of meeting held on the 12th July 2019

The minutes of the meeting were agreed by the councillors and signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

19/070. Public Forum

- a. A member of the public reported that a car accident had occurred in Rectory Road. This was caused by the car hitting the railway sleepers alongside the road. Also, that the hedgerows were overgrown and the overhang of the tree on the other side of the road may be restricting visibility. Clerk will contact the house owner about the tree. Cllr. Taylor said he would consult Suffolk Highways regarding hedgerows and bring-up the problem of the sleepers at the next Newton Trust meeting.
- b. There were no bus timetables in the bus shelters – Clerk to rectify this situation.
- c. Further concerns were expressed about the very poor visibility at the telephone box junction onto the A134 on Rectory Road. The councillors agreed to make further enquiries and contact the owners of the vehicles parked in the lay-by. This will be considered at the next meeting.
- d. Cllr. Parker (Babergh District Council) announced:
 - During the summer months children aged 16 and under who live in the Babergh District are eligible for free swimming at the Kingfisher Leisure Centre & Hadleigh Pool during specified free swim sessions.
