#### **VISIT TO LAVENHAM AIRFIELD**

On a wet, breezy weekend at the end of September the 'Newton walking group' headed to Lavenham where they were given a guided tour around the former airfield.

Hosted by the Friends of Lavenham Airfield (FOLA), the group were told stories of the day to day living conditions and every day heroics of the 3000 or so US Servicemen of the 487<sup>th</sup> Bomb Group stationed at Lavenham between 1943 and 1945. Although it was a relatively short period of time, their presence has left an indelible mark on the area.



Much of the infrastructure of the airfield has long since gone but a good amount still remains, albeit in a state of decay. The group were shown the Commanding Officers quarters, the Officers Club and pieces of machinery discarded by the departing airman which is still in remarkable condition given its exposure to the elements for nearly 75 years. The control tower is in pristine condition and still in use, albeit now as an office suite.

The group were told numerous accounts of extraordinary bravery carried out by young men barely out of their teens and how the combined forces of Lavenham and Sudbury airfields dwarfed the local populations themselves. It must have been an incredible time to have been around.

The Friends of Lavenham Airfield are currently raising funds to build a memorial to those that lost their lives flying from the base. The guided tours are a means of raising funds and cost £10 per head, all of which goes towards the target of £15K being required.
