A big thank you to everyone who sponsored us for the church cycle. It was a lovely day and the weather was perfect!



Subject to the guidance of the professional's shop, play will be available daily from 10.30 am, and 12.30 pm on Saturdays. A condition of Villager Plus membership involves a free, one-hour, introductory session with the club professional.


### **FIRESIDE**
