

16/175 Apologies for Absence

Cllrs Bower, Parker, Schwenk and Taylor (commitments) sent their apologies as did Lee Parker (Babergh District Councillor).

16/176 Declaration of Interests and Requests for Dispensation

No interests were declared and no request for dispensation had been received.

16/177 Minutes of meeting held on the 9th November 2016

The minutes of the meeting were approved by the councillors and signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

16/178 Public Forum

James Finch updated councillors on his previously circulated report and gave further information on Devolution, SCC's Budget and help for Family Carers. He updated councillors on the re-consultation for the proposed speed reductions on the A134 and on the Raising the Bar grant available from the Suffolk Foundation which NPC may wish to apply.

16/179 Correspondence (Appendix A)

Following a review of the Correspondence and the emails circulated since the last meeting there were no further actions requested of the Clerk. The councillors resolved to defer a decision on the use of Newton's name for a youth football team until the Trust had decided on whether the playing field could accommodate the proposed use.

16/180 Clerks Report (Appendix B)

Following a review of the Clerk's Report there were no further actions requested of the Clerk.

16/181 Finance

DECEMBER NEWS

WE'RE STILL HERE AND AIMING TO STAY!

As the club prepares to celebrate its 110th year, it can look back on a decade of massive change, partly induced by golf clubs in general losing 20% of their memberships. Many have been forced to shut up shop and others scale down operations. The fall-out continues, with Waldringfield and the Chelmsford club Channels in the process of closing their 18-hole operations. We have also had to tighten our belt – it's still not that loose, but now has a few spare notches. However, we have still experienced a decade of success on many fronts, and Newton Green is now a well recognised **force in Suffolk golf – and beyond**. We have pioneered new membership initiatives, invested in the course and just achieved a new legal status, while ensuring we offer the assurances and attractiveness of being a members' club – the only one of six clubs in a 12-mile catchment area.

CLUB HOUSE REFURBISHMENT

Early in the New Year work is due to start on a long-needed upgrading of the bar/dining room areas, which will provide a more attractive environment for golfers and organisers of outside function. With input from professional designers, our infrastructure sub committee has been investigating ways of transforming the present small dining room into a stud bar. The club room ceiling will be re-skimmed of the present Artex which will enable the present outdated appearance to be transformed, along with new lighting. There will be new carpetting in the lounge, along with tables and chairs. The present rooms allow for considerable function flexibility, and this will be continued. The clubhouse will be unavailable for around two and half weeks when work commences on Monday, 23rd January.

JIMMY'S BAR

As part of the rebranding of the interior of the club house, and the turning of the dining room into a stud bar, the new facility will be named **Jimmy's Bar**. This honours the late Jimmy Whittle, who recently passed away, having been responsible for leading various building phases of the present club house over a period of three decades. His family has been delighted to involve itself in this project and will participate in an official opening.

Neither need have worried.


After a short engagement, we married the same year we met, in November 1958 and we are still together after 58 years!






