After 10 rounds, there was very little to choose between the top 6 but the honours finally went to the 2014 winners Six Appeal.



Upon registering annually with the club and booking in at the professional's shop before play, residents of the village can enjoy nine holes free golf on the village green. All guests must pay a green fee. An extra nine holes on the private side of the course can be played after paying the appropriate fee at the club shop.

Villager-Plus Membership

To enjoy regular, 18-hole golf, residents can take out Villager-Plus membership of the club, which involves paying half the normal full, seven-day fee (£377.50 in 2017-18). Subject to the guidance of the professional's shop, play will be available daily from 10.30 am, and 12.30 pm on Saturdays. A condition of Villager Plus membership involves a free, one-hour, introductory session with the club professional.

Healthwatch Suffolk is exploring people's experiences of accessing home care services (domiciliary care). It is an opportunity for you, your friends or family members to influence and improve these services now and for the future.

The watchdog wants to hear from people that are currently using home care services, have used them in the past or those who may need help at home but have been unable to obtain support in the county.

Domiciliary care is care provided in a person's home. Sometimes it is called home care or 'Support to Live at Home'. Home care can include support with things like helping people to get out of bed, washing, dressing, getting to work, cooking meals, eating, seeing friends, caring for families and being part of the community.

Healthwatch Suffolk will use your feedback to help it understand the issues that people face when accessing care at home and what needs to be explored in detail as part of its developing project. As the health and care watchdog for Suffolk, it can use the things that people share to shape, influence and improve care to our county's most vulnerable residents.

NOVEMBER 1957:

Newton Green Youth Club: The Tuesday night meetings continue to be well attended. The next Dance is on Tuesday 17th, the proceeds from which will be for club funds. On Monday December 23rd, the Youth Club is going carol singing carrying with it a box for the Church Restoration Fund. On January 8th there will be another Dance and the proceeds this time will go to the Church Restoration Fund. The proceeds from the last Dance amounted to £3 which will be presented to Mrs Bean for the Village Hall Fund.

NOVEMBER 1977: Green Clippings by Frank Rowland: Have you noticed how nice the Jubilee Garden is looking? Harry Buckledee and his team of workers are to be congratulated on making this part of the Village Hall grounds such a delightful spot. Any more help on it though is always appreciated.

Harvest Supper: October has been a busy month at All Saints, Newton Green. The Parish Harvest Supper once again was a most successful function, including musical items by Mrs Molly Fletcher and Mr Handel Evans, which proved very popular. The Parochial Church Council wish to convey their sincere thanks to the very many people who helped to make the Harvest Supper so enjoyable.





17/167 Minutes of meeting held on the 13th September 2017

The minutes of the meeting were approved as a true record.

17/168 Public Forum

- a. A member of the public was concerned over the traffic on Rectory Road and that the verges are overgrown including obstructing the 30mph sign and there are no passing places. Cllr Parker will contact highways regarding the overgrown verges but that to establish new passing places, more evidence would be required.
- b. The member of the public also asked if the buildings and activity on Gaskins Field, Rectory Road had also been looked into and Cllr Parker confirmed that he had contacted enforcement and that he was waiting for a response.
- c. Another member of the public asked if the notification of the appeal for the erection of 10 dwellings at Red House Farm had been discussed. The councillors confirmed that they had received the notification but that the application was not discussed at the September meeting. However, as NPC has not changed its original response, the omission from the September meeting should not be deemed prejudicial to the application.

Hastoe Housing Association had been in contact to confirm that they are currently obtaining quotes for the survey work which is required and once the surveys had been done they will then be able to look at a date for the public consultation.
